

The Knock Out® Rose ranges from 3 to 5 feet tall and equally wide. It produces multiple clusters of terminal blooms, each 3 to 3.5 inches across. These very light, fragrant flowers come in many colors and will bloom from spring until frost. Humidity doesn't seem to bother the Knock Out® Rose, and it's drought and cold tolerant. It's somewhat shade-tolerant but does need about six hours of full sun per day. True to its low maintenance reputation, the Knock Out® Rose doesn't require deadheading and is resistant to aphids, powdery mildew and black spot. Choose a well-drained site with good air movement. $Zones\ 4-9$

Often used for beach stabilization and erosion control, the salt tolerant rugosa rose is not picky about soil conditions and forms a sturdy shrub or hedge. Very fragrant single to semi-double crimson-pink flowers bloom from May to September on 3-6' tall foliage.

This long blooming shrub has arching branches that hold clusters of lavender-pink tubular flowers from mid-summer to fall. Foliage grows 3-5' tall and turns bronze-purple in fall. Use as a hedge or specimen in the mixed border. Plant 3-5' apart.

Abelia

The changing colors through the seasons bring striking contrast to the landscape. In spring leaves are chartreuse-yellow and green. In summer white star-shaped flowers top golden yellow variegated foliage and in fall the foliage becomes orange and red. Grows to 24-30" tall. PP#16988

Abelia x 'Rose Creek' Abelia

Pink tinged in spring, the low mounding 3' tall foliage becomes glossy dark green in summer. Clusters of fragrant tubular white flowers and rose-pink sepals appear on the ends of burgundy stems in late spring to fall. In warmer climates where Abelia remains evergreen the foliage develops a purple hue in winter. Plant 48" apart.



Arbovitae 'Green Giant' (Thuia x 'Green Giant')

Green Giant Arborvitae

Often used as a quick growing screen the dense evergreen foliage can grow 3-4' per year. 'Green Giant' grows 40-60' as a narrow pyramidal-shaped tree or if planted 5-6' apart it can be pruned as a hedge. Prefers moist, fertile, well-drained soil.

Aronia melanocarpa Ground Hug™ Dwarf Black Chokeberry

Dark glossy green deciduous foliage is mat-forming and is excellent used as a ground cover for difficult sites. The 8-14" tall foliage spreads to 3', choking out weeds and eliminating the need to mulch. Native Ground Hug™ has white flowers in spring followed by deep purple berries in late summer and attractive orange-red foliage in fall. Grows 8-14" tall. PP#31821

NewGen Boxwood offers specimens with a vigorous growth habit, high tolerance of Boxwood Blight, good resistance to Boxwood Leafminer and resistance to other diseases and pests. This strong grower requires a light pruning in late winter to early spring to keep the dense rounded shape. Foliage grows slightly taller than wide and will grow to 3.5' tall and wide in 15 years and up to 5'. A good substitute for 'Winter Gem'. PP#32421



A low-growing, late-blooming shrub that reaches a height of only 2-3', with clusters of deepest dark blue flowers from August through September. The foliage is lance-shaped and silvery-green. Will attract flocks of butterflies! Combine with Aster 'October Skies' and Chrysanthemum nipponicum.

This compact form of Caryopteris has deep inky-blue buds that open to large cobalt-blue flowers, which are profuse on erect stems from late August to early October. Best of all, the rounded compact habit means 'First Choice' requires little pruning and won't have the floppy habit some cultivars exhibit. Pest and disease-free, it reaches 36". Blooming in mid to late summer with deep violet blue flowers against silvery green foliage, the effect is said to resemble a blue mist. The aromatic leaves add appeal to this compact shrub. Treat as a perennial and cut to just above ground in late winter. Grows 24-30" in height. PP#17837

Ceonothus americanus New Jersey Tea

In late spring to early summer the fragrant white flower clusters catch the eye of eastern woodland trail hikers, and pollinators, alike. In the garden, New Jersey Tea will do no less. Flower panicles appear at the tips of the stems on low mounded foliage that typically grows 3' tall and 5' wide. This native prefers average to dry soil, and has a deep root system that allows it to survive periods of drought and serve as erosion control. The tap root, however, also makes it difficult to transplant. Plant 5' apart.

Cephalanthus occidentalis

Buttonbush

Tubular white flowers in sphere-shaped clusters open in early to mid-summer. The eye-catching clusters are fragrant, and attract butterflies and a host of other pollinators. Flower heads develop into hard round fruits that persist into winter. The foliage has an open rounded habit and grows 6-12' tall and wide. Prefers moist to wet humus rich soil, but is adaptable to many soil types.

This evergreen conifer has golden yellow needles that are 'stringy' and mop-like. Slow growing it will form a 3' tall and 4' wide mound in about 10 years but can grow as tall as 5'. Use as an accent in the rock garden or shrub border. Prefers average to medium moisture.





Hydrangea quercifolia 'Snow Queen' Oakleaf Hydrangea

Showy conical clusters of white flowers are held on strong stems from late spring through summer. Blooms age to dusty pink and the large oak-like leaves turn bronzy-purple in fall. Exfoliating bark adds winter interest. Under-plant with native Virginia bluebells for early spring color as 'Snow Queen' begins to break dormancy. Grows 5-6 tall and 6-8' wide. Plant 6' apart.

llex verticillata 'Winter Red' Winterberry

Deciduous winterberry is a favorite for its bright red berries on bare stems in winter and attractivness to birds and beneficial insects. Grows 8-10' tall with dark green foliage and small white flowers in late spring. Add a male pollinator, such as Ilex v. 'Southern Gentleman', to cross-pollinate and produce berries on 'Winter Red'.






Itea virginica Little Henry® Dwarf Virginia Sweetspire

The arching shoots of native 'Little Henry' bear the same fragrant white bottlebrush blooms as 'Henry's Garnet', but this handy little deciduous shrub reaches 2 1/2' tall at best. Tidy in shape, the shiny dark green leaves turn brilliantly redpurple in fall. As a foil for competing perennial colors in the border, for foliage contrast, or massed on its own, 'Little Henry' is an alternative worth considering. PP#10988 Plant 3' apart.





Leucothoe axillaris Coastal doghobble

This native evergreen shrub is well suited to moist, shaded areas with protection from winter winds. Grows 2-4' tall with dark leathery green leaves. Fragrant white bell-shaped flowers appear in spring and attract bees and butterflies. Plant in the shade garden with native ferns, pachysandra procumbens and Tiarella. Plant 36" apart.











Myrica pensylvanica Bayberry

Native to eastern coastal areas of the United States and Canada, bayberry's tolerance of drought, poor soils, high winds and salt make it ideal for the coastal landscape. Dark green leathery foliage is deciduous. Aromatic gray berries are commonly used to make candles and soaps. Grows 6-10' tall.





Nandina domestica 'Gulf Stream'

Heavenly Bamboo

Popular used as a foundation plant or sited in a parking lot island because of its moisture and drought tolerance and colorful changing foliage. New leaves in spring are bright red and transition to blue-green in summer followed by deep red in fall. A bit monotonous in a mass planting, try 'Gulf Stream' as an accent in an evergreen border. Grows 30-36" tall and wide.








After a short resting period to promote new growth, this deer resistant beauty springs into action again in mid to late summer blooming intermittently through the fall. Plant as a low hedge along a pathway or under a window where it's sweet fragrance can be enjoyed. PP# 29831 Plant 3' apart.

A profuse, early bloomer, you will have plenty of flowers clusters for cutting and to bring indoors. This deciduous shrub grows 8-10' and has open upright branches covered in bright green heartshaped leaves that stay attractive all summer. Beautiful as a specimen plant or when planted as a flowering hedge. Plant 8' apart.



The white flowers in July-August on strong stems are a delightful after-thought. Plant 2' apart.
